Jehoshaphat (overlap), righteous, 873—848 BC

Jehoram/Joram (overlap), terrible, 853—841 BC

Ahaziah, bad, 841 BC

Athaliah (queen), devilish, 841—835 BC

Joash/Jehoash, mostly virtuous, 835—796 BC

Amaziah, mostly wholesome, 796—767 BC

Uzziah/Azariah (overlap), mostly respectable, 790—739 BC

Jotham (overlap), worthy, 750—731 BC

Ahaz, heinous, 735—715 BC

Hezekiah, the best, 715—686 BC

Manasseh, depraved until he repented at the end, $695-642\ BC$

Amon, treacherous, 642—640 BC


Josiah, great, 640—609 BC

Jehoahaz, dreadful, 609 BC

Jehoiakim, degenerate, 609—597 BC

Jehoiachin, frightful, 597 BC

Zedekiah, foolish, 597—586 BC



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
