My only hope of righteousness is not in me, but only You.


VERSE 2

GRATITUDE IS A VERB: LESSONS FROM A GREAT MAN
2 Kings 5:1-19

The life of a military commander named Naaman was an illustration of God's great grace and the response of a truly grateful person. Naaman's encounter with God was carefully preserved for our benefit and shows us that —

1. The seriousness of Naaman's condition is a reminder of the seriousness of the human condition — 2 Kings 5:1
2. God is constantly connecting people with great needs to the provision of His grace — 2 Kings 5:2-9
3. Our own pride is a dangerous obstacle to the great gifts of God — 2 Kings 5:10-12
4. Gratitude to God should go beyond words to a lifestyle — 2 Kings 5:13-19
